Traditional architecture gave way to clean lines and bold colors, giving this home its modern feel. Jennifer created a "fresh, crisp, and updated interior that feels global and transitional." The homeowner's European roots, experiences and taste are captured in the chic design. "[I] categorize the style of this house as transitional," Jennifer says. "It is founded in the classic but streamlined and tailored to the level of feeling stylish and current." The juxtaposition of neutral and bold colors keeps the house classic and upscale while adding gravitas and interest. "The color strategy was calm and neutral with pops of bold color and pattern," Jennifer says, adding, "The client has an affinity for various hues of

purple." Bold colors and patterns were "vital to the interest" of the home and used "to inject energy and whimsy into each space." In the master bedroom, the stainless steel legs of the armless leather chair convey coolness while the hammered brass table beside it tempers the effect, supplying warmth.

In the living room, the architecture of the fireplace, windows and moldings maintained the classic feel of the home's origins, while the modern art, clean lines of the furniture and neutral tones provided an updated twist. Simple flowers in the center of the room are the only pop of bright color. This room is a perfect place for both elegant entertaining and casual family gatherings.

The focal point in the master bedroom is the bed frame upholstered in luxurious Duralee velvet fabric, which gives the modern room a cozy feel. Heavy curtains in a neutral tone add softness to the large-scale room. For a more dramatic look, the curtains were hung at the ceiling not right above the window. Patterns are kept subtle and do not overwhelm the space. The nightstands are made of beveled glass with an antiqued mirror finish. The antique

gold door pulls tie in with the hammered bases of the brass lamps that will patinate over time. "We're seeing the beauty of brass again," Jennifer says. "Here, it feels natural and a little organic because it's unpolished. It adds style in a global way."

Sleek modern finishes, fixtures and hardware give the kitchen and bathrooms a contemporary and clean feel. In the bathroom, the colors are kept neutral and serene to create a luxurious spa-like vibe.

Function and form are critically important for Jennifer. "I firmly believe as a designer that all spaces should be inviting and lived-in," she says. "Nothing should be off limits to the family that resides there. I also feel that people should live with things that they love, whether it be a textile, furnishings, carpeting or art."

DESIGN 101

JENNIFER PALUMBO SHARES TIPS ON **CRAFTING A STYLISH, MODERN** HOME.

• SHINE A SPOTLIGHT. "It is essential to create strong focal points in each space with either color, pattern or form," Jennifer says. "It's important that when a person enters a space they know exactly where their attention should be first, then second and then third. This hierarchy of focus creates a sense of calm and purpose. It's fresh and not chaotic. This is very much the foundation of a more modern aesthetic."

• UPDATE EXISTING PIECES.

"Already in the homeowner's collection, the bird prints had traditional gold frames." Jennifer reframed them in Lucite to suit the new aesthetic. "We totally turned them on their toes," she says. "You can appreciate the colors of the birds so much more."

• STAY SIMPLE IN BATHROOMS AND KITCHENS. "Keep it calm, work with a great mix of materials and textures that are timeless, create a strong focal point," Jennifer says.

Fresh white trim and neutral walls keep the entryway looking light and airy.
